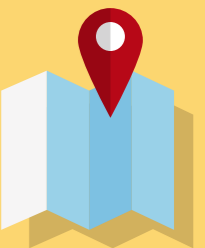
Chinatown Food Trail Map

NON HALAL

MADRAS LANE YONG TAU FOO

The yong tau foo here are made fresh daily, with a vast variety of fish paste stuffed beancurd and vegetables. If you are here during lunch hour, be prepared as it can get pretty packed.

SZE NGAN CHYE | SALTED ROAST DUCK

This stall has been around since the 50's, famous for its perfectly roasted duck with juicy, flavourful meat and crispy crackling skin. Regulars and curious travellers stand in line as early as 8am and takeaway is the only option here.

KIM LIAN KEE | HOKKIEN MEE

A favourite amongst KL locals, the Hokkien Mee at Kim Lian Kee is loaded with fresh seafood and crispy lard. The caramelisation of soy sauce used in this dish also imparts a nice smoky flavour.

CHEE CHEONG FUN

Just off Jalan Hang Lekir, this stall has been serving melt-in-the-mouth Chee Cheong Fun or rice noodle rolls for decades. Their Cantonese-style rice noodle dish is doused with sweet sauce and a sprinkling of sesame seeds. The business is so good that the Chee Cheong Fun is usually sold out by noon.

PORRIDGE HON KEE

This famous stall started in 1959 and still going strong. Come here for breakfast and choose from a wide variety of silky smooth rice porridge. For the more adventurous, try out their frog leg porridge.

SHIN KEE BEEF NOODLE SPECIALIST

ALI, MUTHU & AH HOCK | NASI LEMAK BEREMPAH

The name of the shop symbolizes what Malaysia is, unity! Get a taste of their must-try Nasi Lemak Ayam Berempah, with crispy fried chicken, fragrant rice and a healthy dollop of moderately spicy sambal.

If you love Thai food, but can't take the heat, fret not. Thai Chili's chefs prepare their food fresh by-the-order so you can customize the heat to your liking. The steamed seabass packs a punch with its sweet, sour and spicy notes.

KIM SOYA BEAN MILK

KIM TAU FU FAH

The Tau Fu Fah sold here is firmer in texture but still keeps its silky smooth body. The unique point of this custardy dessert is that the syrup is infused with a subtle hint of ginger.

AIR MATA KUCING
